THOUGHTS FROM FR. EMMANUEL

Friends,

The first reading reminds us of the saying: "A hungry man is an angry man." Due to hunger, the Israelites murmured and revolted against Moses, and consequently, against God. They doubted and put God to the test. They hastily forgot how good and merciful He has been to them and how he separated the Red Sea and defeated their enemies to save them. However, God proved that He is a great provider. He feeds them to satisfaction.

In the gospel, Jesus read the mind of the people following him. He performed the miracle of the multiplication of bread and fish out of necessity. However, like the Israelites, his followers become obsessed with food. They were carried away by physical hunger. They came to search for their daily bread but failed to recognize that Christ was the bread of life.

An important lesson for us today is that when we pay too much attention to material things, we forfeit the spiritual meaning of life. So, our relationship with God and others must not be based solely on how much material things we can get from them or get satisfied by the things of the world. To support us for our spiritual journey on earth, Christ offers us himself at every Mass. He is the only one who can satisfy our hunger. We are indeed blessed as we pray at every Mass: "Blessed are those called to the Lord's supper."

Remember to participate in our monthly activity in this "Year of Mission" as a result of the Eucharistic Revival process. This month's theme is "the Shekinah and transfiguration". Let Jesus in the Eucharist illuminate your heart in adoration.

Dudaron y pusieron a Dios a prueba. Rápidamente olvidaron lo bueno y misericordioso que había sido con ellos y cómo separó el Mar Rojo y derrotó a sus enemigos para salvarlos. Sin embargo, Dios demostró que Él es un gran proveedor. Él los alimenta hasta la satisfacción.

En el evangelio, Jesús leyó la mente de las personas que lo seguían. Realizó el milagro de la multiplicación de los panes y los peces por necesidad. Sin embargo, al igual que los israelitas, sus seguidores se obsesionan con la comida. Fueron arrastrados por el hambre física. Vinieron a buscar el pan de cada día, pero no reconocieron que Cristo era el pan de vida.

Una lección importante para nosotros hoy es que cuando prestamos demasiada atención a las cosas materiales, perdemos el significado espiritual de la vida. Por lo tanto, nuestra relación con Dios y con los demás no debe basarse únicamente en la cantidad de cosas materiales que podemos obtener de ellos o en la satisfacción de las cosas del mundo. Para apoyarnos en nuestro camino espiritual en la tierra, Cristo se ofrece a sí mismo en cada Misa. Él es el único que puede saciar nuestra hambre. De hecho, somos bendecidos cuando rezamos en cada Misa: "Bienaventurados los llamados a la Cena del Señor".
