

THOUGHTS FROM FR. EMMANUEL

Friends,

In writing to the Corinthians, Paul explicitly ties the celebration of the Eucharist to the commemoration of Jesus' death (1 Cor 11:26), as also do Matthew, Mark and Luke, by locating its institution on the night before Jesus died and by the words said over the bread (Luke [22:19]) and the cup (Matthew [26:28], Mark [14:24], Luke [22:20]).

Here the Fourth Evangelist joins this united witness of the early Christian tradition where participation in the eucharistic bread and cup is the means whereby subsequent generations of believers access the saving benefits of Christ's death upon the cross. Participation in the one bread and one cup places believers sacramentally before the cross on Calvary and draws their lives into the rhythm of the sacrificial love that brought Christ to his death and his resurrection.

The sacrament, then, is a parallel way of accessing the same life-giving revelation of God's love described in the Bread of Life discourse up till this point. In fact, we can say that the openness of the passage to both the sapiential and the sacramental meanings places before the reader or hearer that interplay of Word and Sacrament, of faith and ritual, that has been rediscovered and re-emphasised in Catholic theology since Vatican II. Jesus is "Bread from Heaven" both as life-giving Word of revelation and as "real food" and "real drink" in the Sacrament. Faith is required in both cases and faith draws both together in a mutually enriching way. Since the primary meaning of "Eucharist" in Greek is "Thanksgiving", the conclusion of the **Second Reading**, Eph 5:15-20, is, appropriately, an exhortation to "live eucharistically."

Prayer Partners Needed



PENSAMIENTOS DEL P. EMMANUEL

Amigos

Al escribir a los Corintios, Pablo vincula explícitamente la celebración de la Eucaristía a la conmemoración de la muerte de Jesús (1 Cor 11:26), como también lo hacen Mateo, Marcos y Lucas, al ubicar su institución en la noche antes de la muerte de Jesús y por las palabras dichas sobre el pan (Lucas [22:19]) y la copa (Mateo [26:28], Marcos [14:24]. Lucas [22:20]).

Aquí el cuarto evangelista se une a este testimonio unido de la tradición cristiana primitiva, donde la participación en el pan y el cáliz eucarísticos es el medio por el cual las generaciones sucesivas de creyentes acceden a los beneficios salvíficos de la muerte de Cristo en la cruz. La participación en el pan y la copa coloca sacramentalmente a los creyentes ante la cruz en el Calvario y lleva sus vidas al ritmo del amor sacrificial que llevó a Cristo a su muerte y resurrección.

El sacramento, entonces, es una forma paralela de acceder a la misma revelación vivificante del amor de Dios descrita en el discurso del Pan de Vida hasta este punto. De hecho, podemos decir que la apertura del pasaje tanto al significado sapiencial como al sacramental pone ante el lector u oyente esa interacción de Palabra y Sacramento, de fe y ritual, que ha sido redescubierta y reenfatizada en la teología católica desde el Vaticano II. Jesús es "Pan del Cielo" como Palabra de revelación vivificante y como "verdadero alimento" y "verdadera bebida" en el Sacramento. La fe es necesaria en ambos casos y la fe une a ambos de una manera mutuamente enriquecedora. Dado que el significado primario de "Eucaristía" en griego es "Acción de gracias", la conclusión de la **segunda lectura**, Ef 5, 15-20, es, apropiadamente, una exhortación a "vivir eucarísticamente".
