THOUGHTS FROM FR. EMMANUEL

Friends, we celebrate this feast of the Exaltation of the Cross for two reasons: (1) to understand the history of the discovery and recovery of the True Cross and (2) to appreciate better the importance of the symbol and reality of Christ's sacrificial love, namely, the cross in the daily life of every Christian.

The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross is one of twelve "Master feasts" celebrated in the Church to honor Jesus Christ, our Lord and Master. This feast is celebrated to memorialize the first installation of the remnants of the true cross of Jesus in the Church of the Holy Sepulcher on Mount Calvary, September 14, AD 335, and its reinstallation on September 14, AD 630.

The original cross on which Jesus was crucified was excavated in AD 326 by a team led by St. Helena, the mother of the first Christian Roman Emperor, Constantine. The Emperor built the Church of the Holy Sepulcher on Calvary, it was consecrated on September 14, AD 335, and the remains of the cross were installed in it by Archbishop Maccharios of Jerusalem. After three centuries, the Persians invaded Jerusalem, plundered it of all valuables and took with them the relic of the Holy Cross. In AD 630, Emperor Heraclius II defeated the Persians, recaptured the casket containing the holy relic, and reinstalled it in the rebuilt Church, which was destroyed by Muslims in 1009. The crusaders rebuilt it as the present Church of the Holy Sepulcher in 1149. The largest fragment of the holy cross is now kept in Santa Croce Church in Rome. May the Cross lead us to heaven.





PENSAMIENTOS DEL P. EMMANUEL

Amigos, celebramos esta fiesta de la Exaltación de la Cruz por dos razones: (1) para comprender la historia del descubrimiento y recuperación de la Vera Cruz y (2) para apreciar mejor la importancia del símbolo y la realidad del amor sacrificial de Cristo, es decir, la cruz en la vida cotidiana de cada cristiano.

La Fiesta de la Exaltación de la Santa Cruz es una de las doce "Fiestas del Maestro" que se celebran en la Iglesia para honrar a Jesucristo, nuestro Señor y Maestro. Esta fiesta se celebra para conmemorar la primera instalación de los restos de la verdadera cruz de Jesús en la Iglesia del Santo Sepulcro en el Monte Calvario, el 14 de septiembre del año 335 d.C., y su reinstalación el 14 de septiembre del año 630 d.C.

La cruz original en la que Jesús fue crucificado fue excavada en el año 326 d.C. por un equipo dirigido por Santa Elena, la madre del primer emperador romano cristiano, Constantino. El emperador construyó la Iglesia del Santo Sepulcro en el Calvario, fue consagrada el 14 de septiembre del año 335 d.C., y los restos de la cruz fueron instalados en ella por el arzobispo Maccharios de Jerusalén. Después de tres siglos, los persas invadieron Jerusalén, la saquearon de todos los objetos de valor y se llevaron consigo la reliquia de la Santa Cruz. En el año 630 d.C., el emperador Heraclio II derrotó a los persas, recapturó el ataúd que contenía la reliquia sagrada y lo reinstaló en la iglesia reconstruida, que fue destruida por los musulmanes en 1009. Los cruzados la reconstruyeron como la actual Iglesia del Santo Sepulcro en 1149. El fragmento más grande de la santa cruz se conserva ahora en la iglesia de Santa Croce en Roma. Que la cruz nos lleve al cielo.
