

#### THOUGHTS FROM FR. EMMANUEL

Friends, in the Church's liturgical history, the wedding feast of Cana is closely associated with the baptism of the Lord and the adoration of the infant Jesus by the Wise Men. In this context, the sign Jesus performs at the wedding feast is celebrated as an epiphany or a manifestation of Jesus' divinity.

Here, as elsewhere in John's Gospel, Mary is not mentioned by name, but referred to instead as the mother of Jesus. Mary is influential in Jesus' first sign. She will also be present at his Crucifixion, a witness to the final manifestation of his divinity.

Mary's great invitation for us is to do the will of God. Her example of love and obedience to the divine will makes us recipients of the divine grace and mercy. It allows us to witness the miracles of Jesus and to share passionately the gospel of Christ. Let us ask the Holy Spirit to guide us in doing whatever Jesus asks us to do.

Remember that we continue praying for vocations and as we adjust to the traveling chalice in each household, please offer prayers for all vocations; Holy Matrimony, religious life and priesthood.

Finally, at the end of this month we will celebrate Catholic School Week, please make sure to pray for our Academy teachers and scholars. And save the date for our annual pancake breakfast on Sunday, January 26th!


