THOUGHTS FROM FR. EMMANUEL

Friends, in the Church’s liturgical history, the wedding feast of Cana is closely associated with the baptism of the Lord and the adoration of the infant Jesus by the Wise Men. In this context, the sign Jesus performs at the wedding feast is celebrated as an epiphany or a manifestation of Jesus’ divinity.

Here, as elsewhere in John’s Gospel, Mary is not mentioned by name, but referred to instead as the mother of Jesus. Mary is influential in Jesus’ first sign. She will also be present at his Crucifixion, a witness to the final manifestation of his divinity.

Mary’s great invitation for us is to do the will of God. Her example of love and obedience to the divine will makes us recipients of the divine grace and mercy. It allows us to witness the miracles of Jesus and to share passionately the gospel of Christ. Let us ask the Holy Spirit to guide us in doing whatever Jesus asks us to do.

Remember that we continue praying for vocations and as we adjust to the traveling chalice in each household, please offer prayers for all vocations; Holy Matrimony, religious life and priesthood.

Finally, at the end of this month we will celebrate Catholic School Week, please make sure to pray for our Academy teachers and scholars. And save the date for our annual pancake breakfast on Sunday, January 26th!

En este contexto, el signo que Jesús realiza en el banquete de bodas se celebra como una epifanía o una manifestación de la divinidad de Jesús.

Aquí, como en otras partes del Evangelio de Juan, no se menciona a María por su nombre, sino que se la conoce como la madre de Jesús. María es influyente en la primera señal de Jesús. Ella también estará presente en su crucifixión, testigo de la manifestación final de su divinidad.

La gran invitación de María para nosotros es hacer la voluntad de Dios. Su ejemplo de amor y obediencia a la voluntad divina nos hace destinatarios de la gracia y de la misericordia divinas. Nos permite ser testigos de los milagros de Jesús y compartir apasionadamente el evangelio de Cristo. Pidamos al Espíritu Santo que nos guíe en hacer lo que Jesús nos pida que hagamos.
