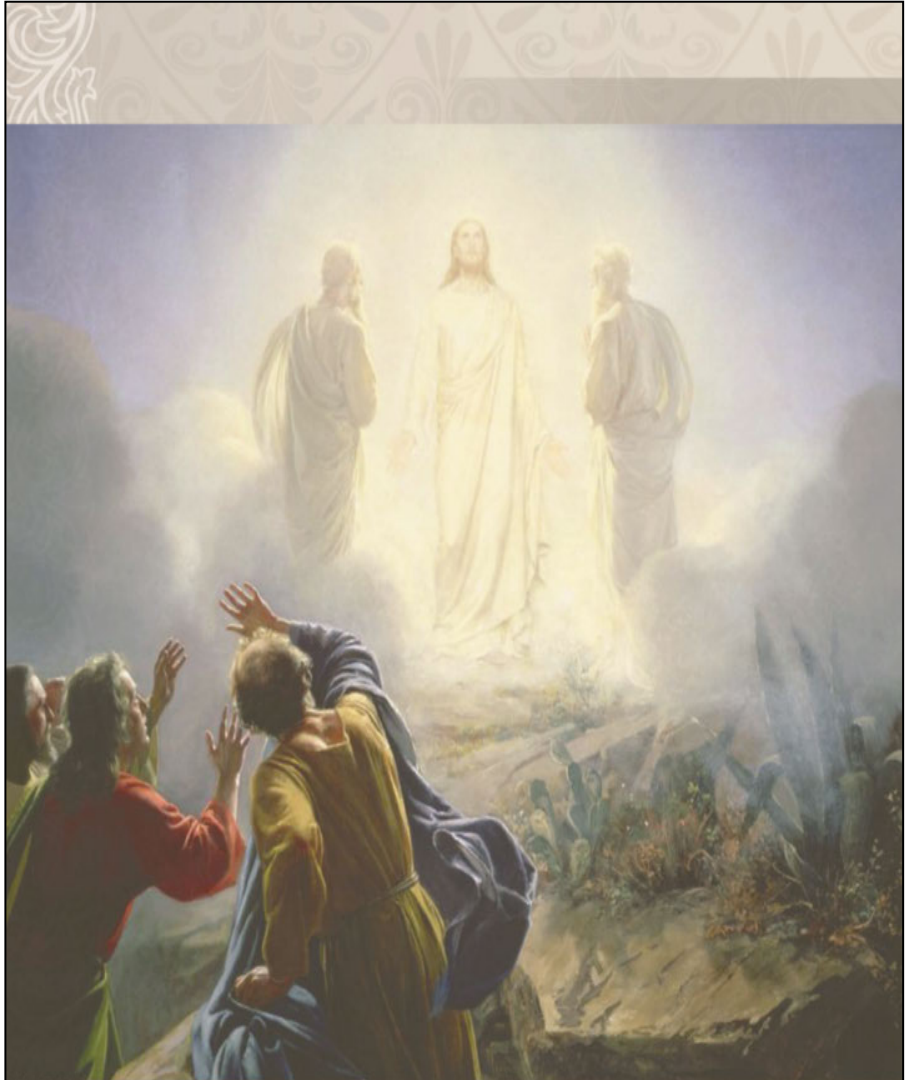

THOUGHTS FROM FR. EMMANUEL

Friends, “Jubilee” is the name given to a particular year; the name comes from the instrument used to mark its launch. In this case, the instrument in question is the *yobel*, the ram’s horn, used to proclaim the Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur). This (Jewish) holiday occurs every year, but it takes on special significance when it marks the beginning of a Jubilee year. We can find an early indication of it in the Bible: a Jubilee year was to be marked every 50 years, since this would be an “extra” year, one which would happen every seven weeks of seven years, i.e., every 49 years (cf. Leviticus 25:8-13). Even though it wasn’t easy to organize, it was intended to be marked as a time to re-establish a proper relationship with God, with one another, and with all of creation, and involved the forgiveness of debts, the return of misappropriated land, and a fallow period for the fields.

In 1300, Pope Boniface VIII called the first Jubilee, also known as a “Holy Year,” since it is a time in which God’s holiness transforms us. The frequency of Holy Years has changed over time: at first, they were celebrated every 100 years; later, in 1343 Pope Clement VI reduced the gap between Jubilees to every 50 years, and in 1470 Pope Paul II made it every 25 years. There have also been “extraordinary” Holy Years: for example, in 1933 Pope Pius XI chose to commemorate the 1900th anniversary of the Redemption, and in 2015 Pope Francis proclaimed the Year of Mercy as an extraordinary jubilee. The way in which Jubilee Years are marked has also changed through the centuries: originally the Holy Year consisted of a pilgrimage to the Roman Basilicas of St. Peter and St. Paul, later other signs were added, such as the Holy Door. By participating in the Holy Year, one is granted a plenary indulgence

Bishop James V. Johnston, Jr., has designated three locations in the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph as Jubilee Year 2025 national pilgrimage sites: the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception at Conception Abbey, the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Kansas City and the Co-Cathedral of St. Joseph in St. Joseph.

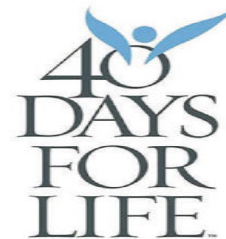

PENSAMIENTOS DEL P. EMMANUEL

Amigos, "Jubileo" es el nombre que se le da a un año en particular; el nombre proviene del instrumento utilizado para marcar su lanzamiento. En este caso, el instrumento en cuestión es el *yobel*, el cuerno de carnero, utilizado para proclamar el Día de la Expiación (Yom Kippur). Esta fiesta (judía) ocurre todos los años, pero adquiere un significado especial cuando marca el comienzo de un año jubilar. Podemos encontrar una indicación temprana de ello en la Biblia: un año jubilar debía marcarse cada 50 años, ya que este sería un año "extra", uno que sucedería cada siete semanas de siete años, es decir, cada 49 años (cf. Levítico 25:8-13). Aunque no fue fácil de organizar, se pretendía que fuera marcado como un tiempo para restablecer una relación adecuada con Dios, entre nosotros y con toda la creación, e implicaba el perdón de las deudas, la devolución de las tierras malversadas y un período de barbecho para los campos.

En 1300, el Papa Bonifacio VIII convocó el primer Jubileo, también conocido como "Año Santo", ya que es un tiempo en el que la santidad de Dios nos transforma. La frecuencia de los Años Santos ha cambiado con el tiempo: al principio, se celebraban cada 100 años; más tarde, en 1343 el papa Clemente VI redujo el intervalo entre los jubileos a cada 50 años, y en 1470 el papa Pablo II lo hizo cada 25 años. También ha habido Años Santos "extraordinarios": por ejemplo, en 1933 el Papa Pío XI eligió conmemorar el 1900^{aniversario} de la Redención, y en 2015 el Papa Francisco proclamó el Año de la Misericordia como un jubileo extraordinario. La forma en que se marcan los Años Jubilares también ha cambiado a lo largo de los siglos: originalmente el Año Santo consistía en una peregrinación a las Basílicas Romanas de San Pedro y San Pablo, más tarde se agregaron otros signos, como la Puerta Santa. Al participar en el Año Santo, se concede una indulgencia plenaria

El Obispo James V. Johnston, Jr., ha designado tres ubicaciones en la Diócesis de Kansas City-St. José como Jubileo Año Jubilar 2025 lugares de peregrinación nacional: la Basílica de la Inmaculada Concepción en la Abadía de la Concepción, la Catedral de la Inmaculada Concepción en Kansas City y la Concatedral de San José en San José.

EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL TIPS & TESTIMONIES

The National Eucharistic Congress recently offered tips on how to share a personal faith testimony about God's grace working in one's life. The Congress pointed out that the First Letter of St. Peter encourages this, as it reads: "Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope, but do it with gentleness and reverence ..." (1 Peter 3:15-16).

"Your story does not have to be about an unhappy or distressing time in your faith journey," the Congress added. "Your testimony could be anything. It could refer to the birth of a child, an encounter with God through a joyful encounter with a stranger, etc."
