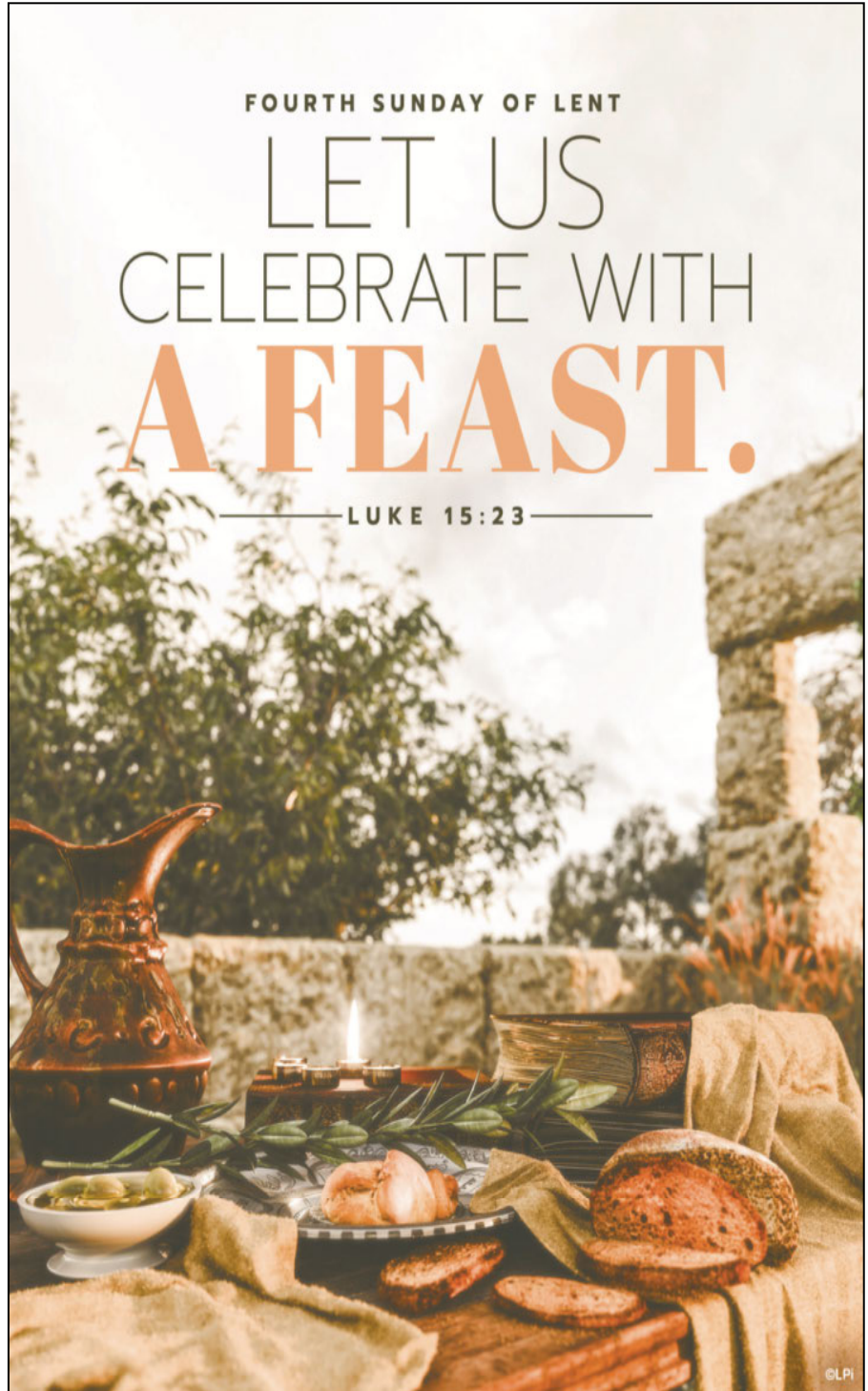

THOUGHTS FROM FR. EMMANUEL

Traditionally, the Fourth Sunday of Lent is called *Laetare Sunday* (Rejoice Sunday). Anticipating Easter joy, today's readings invite us to rejoice by being reconciled with God through repentance and the confession of our sins and by celebrating our coming home to be with our loving and forgiving God.

In this great joy, waiting for the resurrection of Christ, we prepare ourselves to receive the plenary indulgence in this Jubilee Year of Hope by following the next steps:

- Going to confession, repenting from all our sins, asking for forgiveness and resolving not to fall again by the grace of the Holy Spirit.
- Make a pilgrimage to a designated place to receive the indulgence, with in our diocese there are three places for this: 1) Downtown KC Cathedral, 2) The Cathedral of St Joseph in St Joseph MO., and 3) The Basilica of the Immaculate Conception in Conception MO. We as a community are visiting the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, Downtown KC on Thursday April 10th anytime from 4:00pm to 6:30pm. If you cannot make it on this day, you can visit any of the places mentioned above at any time before the end of this year.
- Praying during your pilgrimage, as you drive to the Cathedral, make sure you pray and make your pilgrimage full of devotion to God.
- Praying for the intention of the Holy Father. Before you enter the main doors of the Cathedral we are invited to pray for the intentions of the Holy Father.
- Recite the creed. Before entering the doors, we are invited to make this profession of faith.
- Other prayers before entering the main doors. We are invited to pray the Our Father and the Hail Mary.
- Once we enter the doors, we are invited to spend time in adoration before Jesus in the tabernacle.
- This pilgrimage will end with the celebration of the Holy Eucharist at 7:00 pm by Bishop Johnston in the Cathedral.

Remember that a person desiring to receive the Plenary indulgence must be in state of Grace and follow the steps given by the Church. Let's Get ready to receive this great gift and becoming Pilgrims of Hope.

Tradicionalmente, el Cuarto Domingo de Cuaresma se llama *Domingo Laetare* (Domingo de Alegría). Anticipando la alegría de la Pascua, las lecturas de hoy nos invitan a regocijarnos al reconciliarnos con Dios a través del arrepentimiento y la confesión de nuestros pecados y al celebrar nuestro regreso a casa para estar con nuestro Dios amoroso y perdonador.

En esta gran alegría, esperando la resurrección de Cristo, nos preparamos para recibir la indulgencia plenaria en este Año jubilar de la esperanza siguiendo los siguientes pasos:

- Ir a la confesión, arrepentirnos de todos nuestros pecados, pedir perdón y decidir no volver a caer por la gracia del Espíritu Santo.

- Recita el credo. Antes de entrar por las puertas, se nos invita a hacer esta profesión de fe.
- Otras oraciones antes de entrar por las puertas principales. Se nos invita a rezar el Padre Nuestro y el Ave María.
- Una vez que entramos por las puertas, se nos invita a pasar un tiempo en adoración ante Jesús en el tabernáculo.
- Esta peregrinación finalizará con la celebración de la Sagrada Eucaristía a las 7pm horas por el Obispo Johnston en la Catedral.

Recuerde que una persona que desee recibir la indulgencia plenaria debe estar en estado de gracia y seguir los pasos dados por la Iglesia. Preparémonos para recibir este gran regalo y convertirnos en Peregrinos de Esperanza.

EUCCHARISTIC REVIVAL TIPS & TESTIMONIES

Following is a testimony shared by Connie Wood:

God has always been a close and present Father to me, and I have had many wonderful experiences as His daughter. Here is one of them.

When my children were small, I was told I had a pituitary tumor at the base of my brain, dangerously close to my optic nerve. It was causing hormone issues, but I also could die from it or go blind if it grew. This news didn't frighten me at all, and I was never concerned. I trust My Father in everything, and accept whatever His Will is for me. I had a clear knowing that He wanted me to finish raising the children He entrusted to me. I told My Heavenly Dad I would suffer or do whatever He wanted of me in this, but knew He would allow me to finish raising my children. The doctor talked about surgery, but I knew God would take the tumor away in His time. So, I took medicine every day, kept up with MRI's, blood tests and Visual Field tests every 6 months for 15 years. Just after my youngest child graduated from high school, the tumor disappeared. My Father's grace allowed me to not only raise my children, but even my grandchildren now too. Our Father's love, mercy, and faithfulness is incredible
