**THOUGHTS FROM FR. EMMANUEL**

Friends, whenever we celebrate Mass we pray the Agnus Dei - "Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us." Then, just moments before the distribution of Holy Communion, the priest raises the host and chalice and says, "Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world." These words are so familiar that they can slip past us without much thought. But today's Gospel - John the Baptist's proclamation "Behold the Lamb of God" - gives us the chance to stop, to listen, and to ask what these words actually mean. What is the Church inviting us to see every time the priest raises the host and chalice? And what did John mean when he first spoke these words on the banks of the Jordan? When John the Baptist points to Jesus and says, "Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world," he is speaking words that have shaped Christian worship from the earliest centuries. The Church deliberately places these words immediately before Communion so that we hear them at one of the most sacred moments of the liturgy. In a sense, what John did by the Jordan is re-enacted at every Mass: the priest, standing in the role of John, points out the Lamb.

This priestly insight is why the Church places John's words on the lips of the priest at every Mass. When the priest elevates the host and chalice and says, "Behold the Lamb of God," he stands in the role of John the Baptist. He points to the true Lamb, the true sacrifice, the One who takes away the sin of the world. The priest today does what John did: he directs our eyes to Jesus. Every Mass is therefore a continuation of that moment at the Jordan. The Lamb is present - sacramentally, truly, substantially. The priest, like John, points him out. And the people, like the disciples who heard John's words, are invited to draw near, to follow, to enter into communion with the Lamb of God.

Please make sure to participate in Catholic Schools Week beginning next Sunday and invite your family and friends to support our Academy.



## PENSAMIENTOS DEL P. EMMANUEL

Amigos, cada vez que celebramos misa rezamos el Agnus Dei - "Cordero de Dios, quita los pecados del mundo, ten piedad de nosotros." Luego, justo antes de la distribución de la Sagrada Comunión, el sacerdote levanta la hostia y el cáliz y dice: «He aquí el Cordero de Dios, contemplad el que quita los pecados del mundo.» Estas palabras son tan familiares que pueden escaparse sin pensarlo mucho. Pero el Evangelio de hoy —la proclamación de Juan el Bautista «He aquí el Cordero de Dios»— nos da la oportunidad de detenernos, de escuchar y de preguntarnos qué significan realmente estas palabras. ¿Qué nos invita la Iglesia a ver cada vez que el sacerdote levanta la hostia y el cáliz? ¿Y qué quiso decir Juan cuando pronunció estas palabras por primera vez en las orillas del Jordán? Cuando Juan el Bautista señala a Jesús y dice: «He aquí el Cordero de Dios que quita el pecado del mundo», está pronunciando palabras que han moldeado la adoración cristiana desde los primeros siglos. La Iglesia coloca deliberadamente estas palabras inmediatamente antes de la Comunión para que las escuchemos en uno de los momentos más sagrados de la liturgia. En cierto sentido, lo que hizo Juan junto al Jordán se recrea en cada misa: el sacerdote, de pie en el papel de Juan, señala al Cordero.

Esta visión sacerdotal es la razón por la que la Iglesia pone las palabras de Juan en los labios del sacerdote en cada Misa. Cuando el sacerdote eleva la hostia y el cáliz y dice: «He aquí el Cordero de Dios», se pone en el papel de Juan Bautista. Señala al verdadero Cordero, el verdadero sacrificio, aquel que quita el pecado del mundo. El sacerdote de hoy hace lo que hizo Juan: dirige nuestra mirada hacia Jesús. Por tanto, cada Misa es una continuación de ese momento en el Jordán. El Cordero está presente —sacramentalmente, verdaderamente, sustancialmente. El sacerdote, como John, lo señala. Y el pueblo, como los discípulos que escucharon las palabras de Juan, está invitado a acercarse, a seguir, a entrar en comunión con el Cordero de Dios.

Por favor, asegúrate de participar en la Semana de las Escuelas Católicas que comienza el próximo domingo e invita a tu familia y amigos a apoyar nuestra Academia.


