THOUGHTS FROM FR. EMMANUEL

Friends, we come to the end of the great Sermon of the mountain, and with-it Jesus will invite us to place our focus and mission in the Kingdom of Heaven. The main meditation in this chapter 5 of the Gospel of Matthew, is the title given to Jesus: "Christ the Teacher" and of course his teachings.

In the first part Jesus is directing his teachings to us to achieve happiness in life and endure all the challenges of this world to enter the kingdom. The invitations among several are to keep our hearts pure, to show mercy, and to practice justice.

In the second part, The Teacher is sending us on a mission and is asking us to become Christ for others. Christ for the oppressed so they may enjoy of freedom; Christ for those who lack faith so they may come back to God and enjoy of faith; Christ for the poor so they may be enriched the same way Christ has enriched us with his divinity.

This weekend after these profound teachings he is talking about the Kingdom, the reality of divine majesty, and the splendor of heaven. Now, how to do good in gaining the kingdom for us? Easy!! just following the teachings of the Teacher who says: "whoever obeys and teaches these commandments will be called greatest in the kingdom of heaven"

So, as we enter the precious time of Lent, take time to live deeply the teachings of Jesus and see the Lord giving testimony of these lessons with his own passion and death, and let's get ready to understand the mystery of our Salvation in the glory of the resurrection.

Remember this week we begin Lent with Ash Wednesday, and we are offering ashes all day long in the Church. Masses are 8:30 am and 6:00 pm in English and 7:30 pm in Spanish.

Finally, Fasting on Ash Wednesday is for ages 16 to 65. Fasting is a piece of plain bread and a cup of tea/water in the morning and at night and a simple meal at lunch. No meat. Those who are sick are not obliged to fast. Prayer and fasting always go together.



Amigos, llegamos al final del gran Sermón de la montaña, y con él Jesús nos invitará a poner nuestro foco y misión en el Reino de los Cielos. La meditación principal en este capítulo 5 del Evangelio de Mateo es el título dado a Jesús: "Cristo el Maestro" y, por supuesto, sus enseñanzas.

En la primera parte, Jesús dirige sus enseñanzas hacia nosotros para alcanzar la felicidad en la vida y soportar todos los desafíos de este mundo para entrar en el reino. Las invitaciones entre varios son mantener nuestro corazón puro, mostrar misericordia y practicar la justicia.

En la segunda parte, El Maestro nos envía en una misión y nos pide que nos convirtamos en Cristo para los demás. Cristo por los oprimidos para que puedan gozar de libertad; Cristo para aquellos que carecen de fe para que puedan volver a Dios y disfrutar de la fe; Cristo para los pobres, para que se enriquezcan de la misma manera que Cristo nos ha enriquecido con su divinidad.

Este fin de semana, tras estas profundas enseñanzas, habla sobre el Reino, la realidad de la majestad divina y el esplendor del cielo. Ahora, ¿cómo hacer el bien para ganar el reino para nosotros? ¡Fácil! simplemente siguiendo las enseñanzas del Maestro que dice: "quien obedezca y enseñe estos mandamientos será llamado el mayor en el reino de los cielos"


