

THOUGHTS FROM FR. EMMANUEL

Friends, in Matthew's gospel the Transfiguration comes after Peter's answer to Jesus' question: "Who do you say I am?" In his account it seems that it is beginning to dawn on some of the disciples, that, despite the popular expectation of a Messiah as a political liberator, Jesus the confident but kindly person is the one sent from God as the Messiah.

Matthew follows this event with Jesus' first announcement of his forthcoming arrest, trial and death, followed by resurrection. That last phrase might seem difficult for the disciples, yet there were beliefs that Moses never quite died and that Elijah would return to earth again, before the Messiah comes.

It is after these events in Matthew's story of Jesus, that the inner three disciples are taken onto a mountain (in the bible a place of revelations) and there they had a vision (as Matthew calls it) of the glory of Jesus, in conversation with Moses and Elijah, and then comes a cloud of God's presence, and they hear God's voice (which often refers to thunder during a storm).

An announcement comes, as made at Jesus' baptism, proclaiming: "my beloved son" but adding "listen to him!" Hear what he has said, namely, that opposition, suffering and death will come and then new life. Matthew's good news for you and me might be that life will not be easy all the time, but for those who can see it the deeper reality is there, and there will certainly come death, but just as surely, life after death, when we have fulfilled our vocation.



PENSAMIENTOS DEL P. EMMANUEL

Amigos, en el evangelio de Mateo la Transfiguración viene después de la respuesta de Pedro a la pregunta de Jesús: "¿Quién decís que soy?" En su relato parece que algunos discípulos empiezan a darse cuenta de que, a pesar de la expectativa popular de un Mesías como libertador político, Jesús, la persona segura pero bondadosa, es quien fue enviado por Dios como el Mesías.

Mateo sigue este evento con el primer anuncio de Jesús sobre su próximo arresto, juicio y muerte, seguido de la resurrección. Esa última frase puede parecer difícil para los discípulos, pero se creía que Moisés nunca murió del todo y que Elías volvería a la tierra antes de que llegara el Mesías.

Es después de estos acontecimientos en la historia de Jesús de Mateo, cuando los tres discípulos internos son llevados a una montaña (en la Biblia un lugar de apocalipsis) y allí tuvieron una visión (como la llama Mateo) de la gloria de Jesús, en conversación con Moisés y Elías, y luego llega una nube de la presencia de Dios, y oyen la voz de Dios (que a menudo se refiere a un trueno durante una tormenta).


Se hace un anuncio, como el que se hizo en el bautismo de Jesús, proclamando: "mi amado hijo" pero añadiendo "¡escúchale!" Escucha lo que ha dicho, es decir, que la oposición, el sufrimiento y la muerte vendrán y luego nueva vida. La buena noticia de Matthew para ti y para mí puede ser que la vida no será fácil todo el tiempo, pero para quienes pueden verla la realidad más profunda está ahí, y ciertamente llegará la muerte, pero con la misma seguridad, vida después de la muerte, cuando hayamos cumplido nuestra vocación.

SACRED HEART TESTIMONIAL

Sam and I attended Mass on 11/23/25 and heard Fr. Lopez’s homily on the dedication to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Later when I was at home I opened a drawer that was too full of all kinds of things that had been put aside and forgotten - old photos, keys, cards, broken pencils... you get the picture. I was looking at a picture of Sam and a softball team he coached shortly after we met in college. A leaflet fell out, yellowed with age and on the front was a picture of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The headline inside the leaflet read 'HOW TO BE HAPPY', and there were prayers and devotions to the Sacred Heart. The IMPRIMATUR date was January 5, 1953. I'm sure this was from my mom & dad; maybe they sent it to me when I was young, and it was too much for me at that time. I don't remember. It was peculiar finding it right after hearing Father’s homily that day, November 23, the anniversary of my mother's death. I read the leaflet and decided to try including the prayer in our daily prayers.

Then, on December 7th, I attended the All Council Meeting where Fr. Lopez shared more details about how St. Regis Parish would celebrate our dedication to the Sacred Heart in conjunction with the St. Regis Day celebration, beginning Friday, June 12, 2026. Wait, I thought, did I hear that right? June 12th is my father's birthday.

I'm not sure what all of this means. Maybe I am meant to be part of the core team. Whatever it means, I just want to share my story and ask what I can do to help. Of course, we will continue to pray for Fr. Lopez and for our parish. We appreciate your prayers too.
