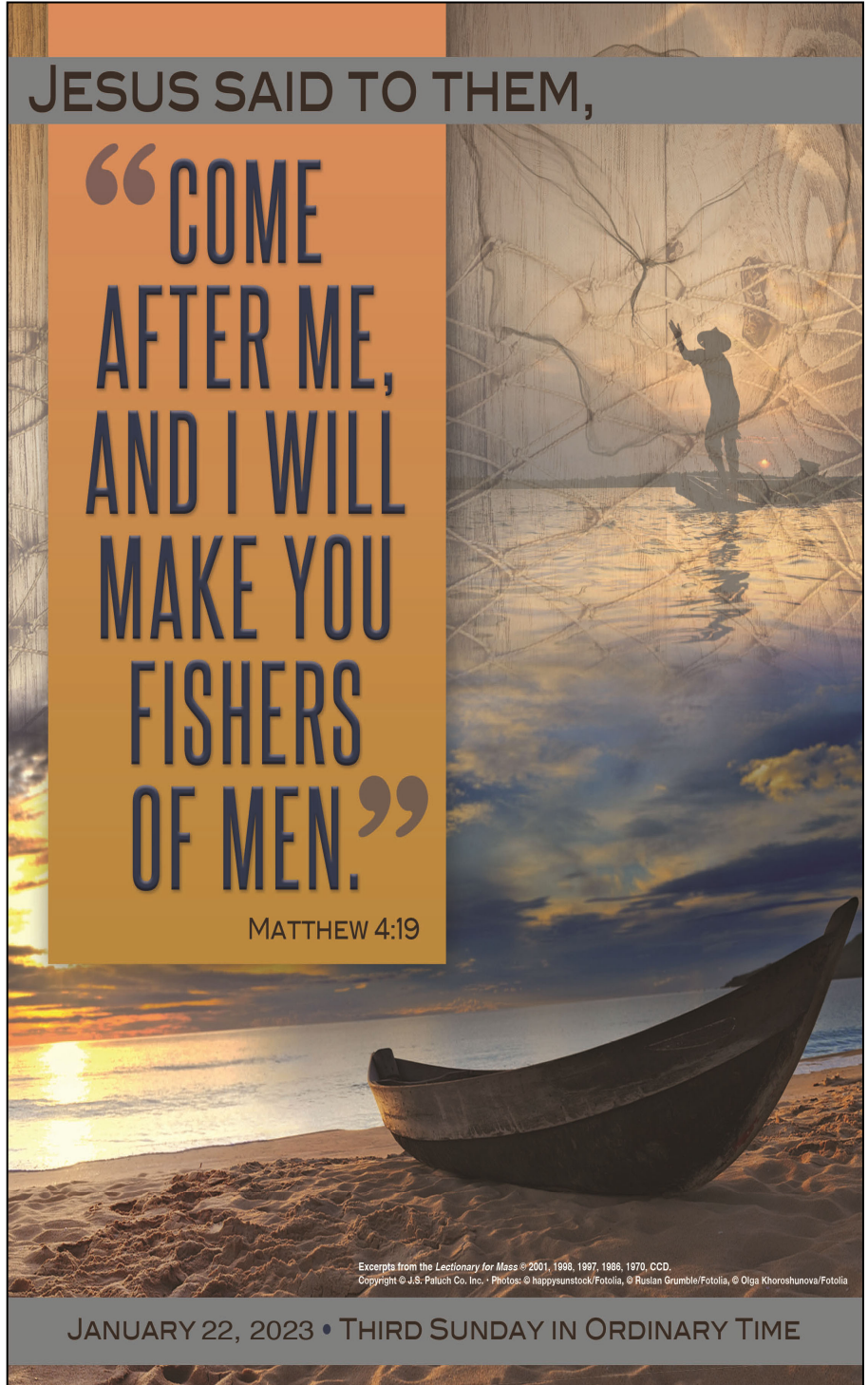

ST. REGIS STEWARDSHIP CORNER

What keeps us from revealing God’s glory to others?
