ST. REGIS STEWARDSHIP CORNER

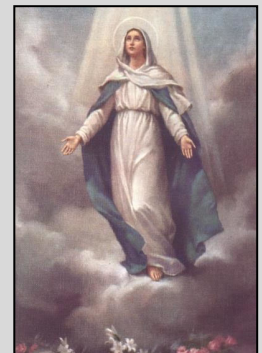

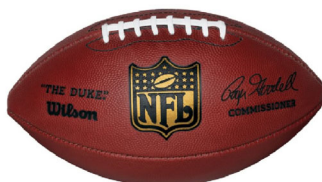
