The lack of economic resources causes great obstacles for young people who dream of continuing higher education. The scholarship program offer those resources.

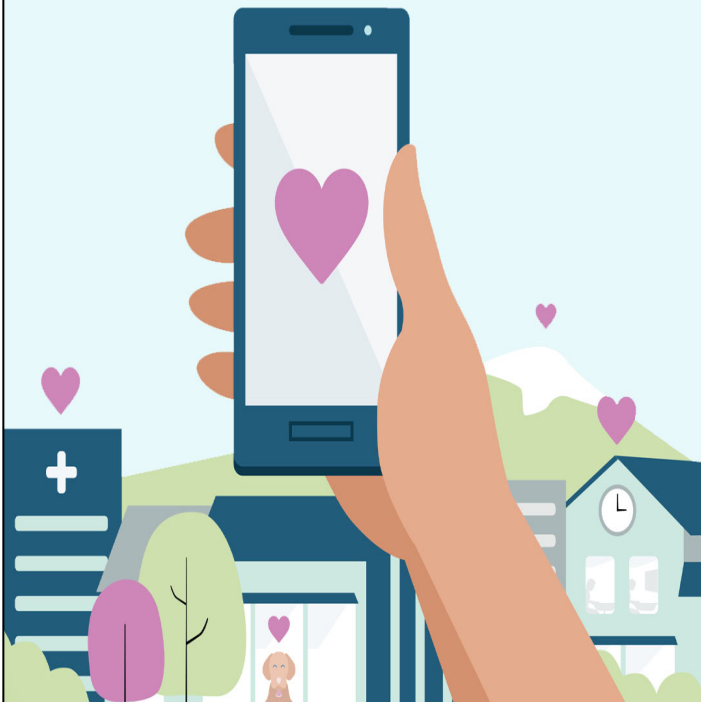
After graduating high school I hope to find work to help my children continue their education goals.”
