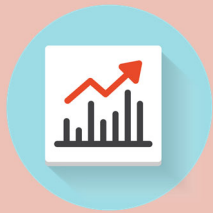

LOST & FOUND

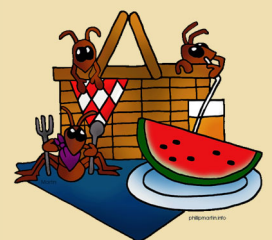
A hearing aid was found in the Church parking lot a couple of weeks ago. If you know someone who may have lost it please contact the Parish Office.

Gladis is in her first year at Universidad de El Salvador. She is projected to have an Architecture degree by 2025. She lives with her mother, Sandra (34), a university graduate, who is currently a Professor.

“Thanks to the scholarship program, I have achieved studying and graduating from high school and now have the opportunity to keep studying at the University to accomplish my dream of being a professional.

One of the greatest obstacles for me is the distance from my home to the University (about 65Km away) and there is no public transport in my community. There is only one bus per day that leaves at 8:00am to the nearest village, and for this reason I had to emigrate to the place I study from Monday to Friday, and live in an apartment with 6 people from different communities. In the community we don't have an internet cafe so when we want to print work out or send an email we have to travel 5km to do it.

My plans are first to graduate with an Architecture degree and then find a job as a professional. I want to help my family economically and then help the youth in my community.”
