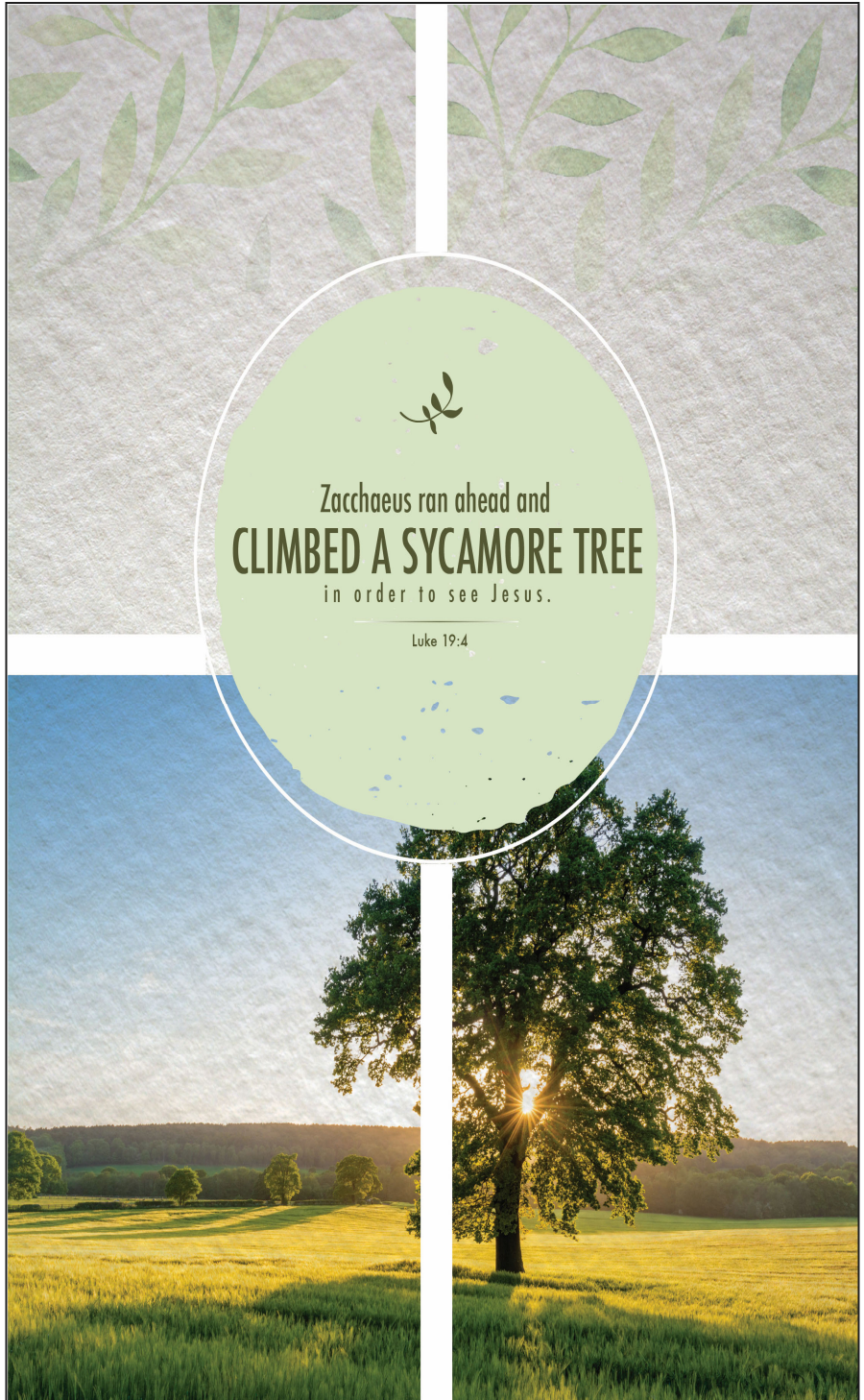

### ST. REGIS STEWARDSHIP CORNER

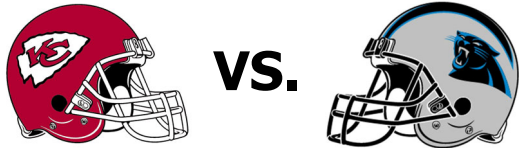

Even though Zacchaeus was a sinner he has a desire to be saved and Jesus knows this and calls him my name. Jesus shows his unbounded mercy.

As we prepare for our Ministry Fair at St. Regis on November 12 and 13, let us reflect on these readings. Signing up for a ministry is a wonderful way to accept Jesus more fully in our lives. Will we be prepared like Zacchaeus was?

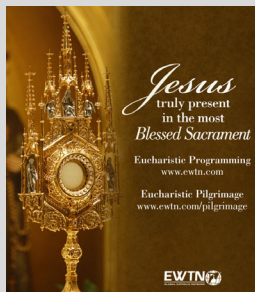


