In our fast-paced and highly technological world of today, many people struggle to belong. We look to phone, tablet, or computer screens for belonging but we find that they leave us feeling empty and longing for more (or another round of likes on another comment or photo). Even if you haven't been sucked into this world yourself, you feel the effects of it in the way other people have started relating to you. This can lead to despair and worry about whether the world can regain some of its lost humanity. One of the most powerful things of Pope Francis' pontificate so far is his emphasis on encounter.

He has called all of us back to encounter others: those in need, those who are ill, imprisoned, those that are lonely and afraid, and simply to encounter one another as friends and people who genuinely care for each other. As Christians, this has to be a part of who we are. This will take work and building new habits and choosing to participate in things that we have often said no to. Think about this: Jesus asked Peter to walk on water. That must have been an uncomfortable proposition for Peter, but he did it. He walked on water. If we take a small risk and step out in friendship with others that we normally don't, perhaps God will do amazing things to build a sense of belonging in our lives and in our community.

This week I encourage every one of us to step out to encounter people in a new way. It may be people at work, in this community, or it may be inviting someone to something here at Regis. Take a small risk in faith this week and see what amazing things God will do with it!


