ST. REGIS STEWARDSHIP CORNER

The readings for this 20th Sunday of Ordinary Times are not very comforting. From Jeremiah being thrown in the well in the First Reading, to the struggles of running the race against every burden and sin that cling to us in Hebrews, to Jesus saying in the Gospel: "I have come to set the earth on fire" and talking about division of families that follow him. The readings seem to suggest intense conflict.

The fire that Jesus mentions is the fire of the Holy Spirit. We are called to be on fire for our faith and our Lord and that there may be challenges that come with being faithful stewards. Jesus is not saying that these conflicts and division are inevitable, but he does want us to be aware that pursuing stewardship as a way of life may cause these problems. If we encounter division or conflict, we must turn to the power of the Holy Spirit and prayer.

In today's second reading, St Paul encourages us not to grow weary or lose heart, but to persevere in following Jesus. Our willingness to give of ourselves, even in the face of conflict and division, is one way to measure our discipleship.


