### ST. REGIS STEWARDSHIP CORNER

All of the readings this 21<sup>st</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Times deal with salvation. In the First Reading from the prophet Isaiah, God declares he comes to gather all people of the world to experience his glory. This reading confirms that we are part of that same mission and that as Disciples of Christ we are all called to be missionaries.

The second reading from the Letter to the Hebrews reminds us that we can all be saved, but that it is not always easy. It reminds us that God is a loving God, but sometimes it may seem that he is severe; but think of it of how loving parents discipline their children. That parent's discipline is guiding that child to be a better Christian. God is our parent and he loves us, but he also knows that there are times when we need to be corrected.

In the Gospel, Jesus is speaking of salvation when he answers a follower's question about who will be saved. Jesus replies that many will try to enter through the narrow gate but will not be strong enough. We must remember that Jesus is the gate and the gatekeeper. The key to entering through the gate is to follow Jesus, be His disciple and try to fulfill his expectations. Following the stewardship way of life is an important part of our path to the gates of heaven.


